Learning More About the 2023-2024 District Project

NJ Key Club is ecstatic to reintroduce our District Project for the 2023-2024 service year, "Education is the KEY." This project strives to address educational disparities in New Jersey and provide access to quality education for children from all backgrounds and abilities.



District Project 2023-2034 "Education is the KEY"



Over the past few years, many New Jersey students, especially those from marginalized communities, have experienced significant learning loss. Simultaneously, high school course loads are expected to be more rigorous than ever, and standardized test score ranges are continuously increasing. An enormous amount of pressure and strain are being placed on students, yet students are disproportionately impacted by these educational strains, and low income communities are still facing reduced resources that prevent equal opportunity. Schools in low-income areas may receive less funding than necessary to provide a quality education, leading to a lack of essential resources, outdated facilities, and insufficient support services. Ensuring that every student has access to a wellfunded education is crucial for breaking the cycle of poverty and improving overall societal well-being. Low-income students not only contend with disparities in education quality but also lack access to advantageous resources available to their wealthier peers. Private tutoring, SAT prep, and college counselors can significantly impact college admissions, yet these opportunities may be out of reach for less affluent students. The 2023-2024 NJKC District Project: Education is the KEY aims to combat educational disparities in New Jersey and increase access to quality education for students of all ages and backgrounds. Building on the success of the previous year, NJKC has already made significant strides, including a Fall Rally Book Drive to collect books for low-income communities, a statewide flash-card-based service project at DECON, and a week of service centered around Education is the KEY. Participation in the project extends beyond the district board, as numerous school clubs collaborate to make a concerted effort. By addressing educational disparities at both the district and club levels, NJKC seeks to create a more inclusive and equitable education system in New Jersey.

That is why it is essential to raise awareness and provide ways Key Club members can involve themselves in environmental wellness efforts. The Advocacy Committee recognizes the power of student-led clubs in effecting change.



June/July - Eco-Friendliness (Plant More Trees)
August/September - Better Methods of Transportation
October/November - Waste disposal/Recycling Program
December/January - Fast fashion/Sustainable fashion
February/March - Park Cleanliness Cleanups of Local Parks

By encouraging clubs to align with these bi-monthly themes, the committee aims to maximize impact and engagement. Here is a brief description of those bimonthly focuses and different ways the committee intends to engage students this service year! For the months of October and November, the committee will prioritize waste disposal and recycling, aiming to establish a comprehensive recycling program within schools. Students will be encouraged to reduce waste and recycle responsibly. The committee also plans to encourage clubs to have a recycling collection fundraiser. This can involve a drop-off where people can bring cans and bottles to a set location on a specific day. The committee plans to release awareness campaigns on the importance of proper waste management. This includes but is not limited to social media. It can also include podcasts, videos, etc. The Advocacy committee this year hopes to provide Key Clubbers with tools and resources needed to make a positive impact on the environment.
